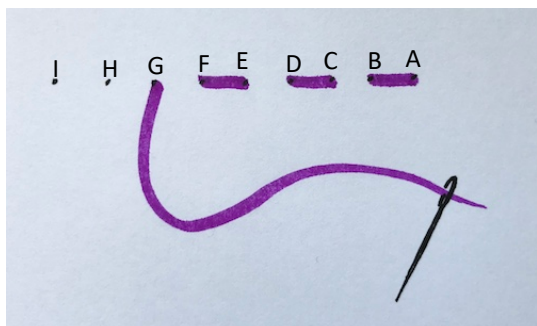


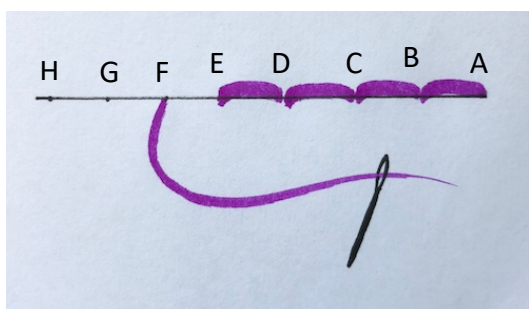
Stitch Instructions

Running Stitch



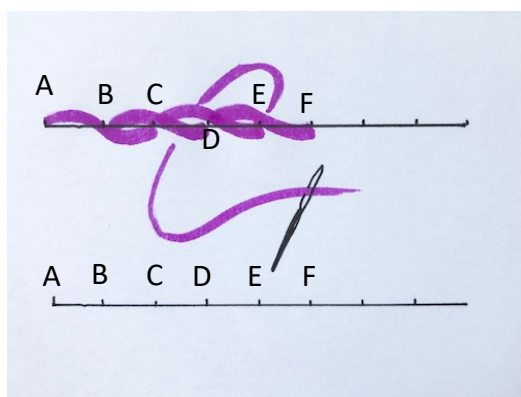
The stitches should be of equal length. On the Tigley Textiles kits, running stitch is represented with dots to make it easier to stitch. The needle comes up at A and goes down at B, up at C and down at D and so on. Be careful not to pull when you stitch or you may end up gathering up the fabric.

Back Stitch



I love Back stitch. It's a really neat flat stitch, especially good for small curves and outlines. Bring the needle up at B, then go back, down at A. Bring it up at C, and go back, down at B, in the same hole as before. Up at D, back down at C and so on. The stitches should be a consistent, even size.

Stem stitch



This stitch is great for outlines and stems, giving a more solid, rope like appearance. Bring the needle up at A, go down at C. bring the needle up at B and down at D etc. Make sure that the hanging thread is always down out the way. Each time a stitch is made it overlaps the previous one.
